FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Lake Nona Academy of Health Science?	The Lake Nona AoHS is a program designed to give students opportunities to learn and experience job opportunities within healthcare fields. Within the three career pathways, students will learn about health careers and will have the opportunity to talk with industry professionals, visit area hospitals, etc.
What is the difference between an academy and a magnet program?	In Orange County Public Schools, magnet programs are specialized, district-wide, programs that offer students career training opportunities. Students apply to these magnet programs and if accepted, can attend that program at that school. An academy is a "school within a school", in which students at a given school can be accepted into a program to receive career training opportunities. Students from other schools may not attend an academy.
What program tracks are included in your Health Career Academy program?	Our AoHS offers three program pathways, offering something for everybody. The programs are: 1) Certification (LNHS), 2) University Preparatory (LNHS, dual enrolled), and 3) Orange Technical College (OCPS Tech College campus, ½ day). Each program is different and offers experiences specifically related to that program. We also offer courses in athletic training for students interested in that career field.
Is there an application?	The application will be submitted when the student has finished HS Anatomy & Physiology, usually at the end of 10 th grade.
Where will students fit the Health Career Academy into their schedule?	Health Science electives will complement the student's schedule. Counselors will create the student's schedules based on preferences for electives.
