## Dual Enrollment (DE) at a Glance

- •The Dual Enrollment program is an opportunity for students to take college courses while in high school
- •Can be through Valencia, UCF, UF and/or OTC
- •Requires a minimum of a 3.0 HS unweighted (Valencia), 3.6 unweighted (UF), recalculated 3.8 GPA (UCF) and college-ready test scores (*PERT*, *SAT*, *PSAT* and/or *ACT*)
- •Recommend waiting until Junior Year for most DE Courses; Speak with your counselor if you are interested in this program
- •Deadlines are NOT Flexible; Students must advocate for themselves
- •Weighted GPA -- A = 6pts

## Dual-Enrollment Benefits & Considerations (on track to graduate with an AA)

#### Benefits

- For in-state institutions, it can shorten the time to complete undergraduate degree. Students have experience with college scheduling and classes while in high school.

- Save money towards earning a degree.
  Ability to satisfy high school requirements as well as AA degree requirements.

#### Considerations

- There is no guarantee all credits will count for an AA degree earned while in high school. It is up to the institution to decide how many credits they will accept.
- Can cause issues with future employment if the student is too young and has no job experience. A major must be declared once student starts college. If student is unsure of what they want to
- study, this can cause issues for them.
- Dual Enrollment is NOT a direct connect to any institution. Students must still apply to the college as a first time college student, not a transfer student.

## College Considerations

When asked what 4 year universities want in their applicants they continue to reiterate rigorous courses and students taking advantage of all the possibly courses the school offers.

They also want to see a math, science, English and social studies <u>each year</u> of high school.

ENC1101 and ENC1102 both count as a full credit of English meaning if you take both of them too soon you will need to take a literature or other type of English class to be competitive your senior year. We recommend not speeding through and taking ENC1101 and 1102 until Spring of Junior year.

AP English Language and Composition also can award credit for ENC1101 and 1102

## **High School Requirements**

- Beginning in the 2023-24 school year, students will be unable to take high school requirement courses in the spring semester of graduation.
- High School counselors are unable to see the status of your DE courses and if you do not pass a course you may be unable to walk in graduation as you cannot retake the courses in our credit recovery system.
- All high school graduation courses will need to be either taken in the fall of senior year at Valencia or taken throughout the school year at LNHS.
  - Typically this means completing the senior English, US Gov and Economics class with us or in the

## **High School Requirements**

- Failure to successfully schedule and complete the required courses by January of the senior year will result in students being placed in the course on campus.
  - STUDENTS CANNOT ATTEMPT COURSES IN SPRING OF SENIOR YEAR ON FLVS!!!
- Due to many of our courses being full year courses, students are unable to come out of core classes or AP courses to take courses at Valencia in the Spring.
  - Students are welcome to take elective courses in the spring or courses not currently on their schedule

## Academic and Disciplinary Behavior

When not in classes you cannot be on LNHS campus unless for special designated reason

You must adhere to OCPS Student Conduct policies and Valencia/ UCF/UF/OTC policies

Be aware of Add/Drop dates and Withdrawal deadline

The student can DROP a class anytime from when it is scheduled until the Drop Deadline of a term. This is without penalty and will not be show his/her record.

Fall Drop Deadline: August 28, 2023 (Valencia)

Spring Drop Deadline: January 16, 2024 (Valencia)

You are only allowed one withdrawal (W) while in the DE program so please before W/D from a class speak to your School Counselor. A second withdrawal will result in dismissal from the program. (Valencia)

If you W/D or drop a class you will be required to pick up an additional LNHS class to compensate for the Valencia period. (Valencia)

## Remaining in Good Standing with LNHS and DE

DE students must maintain the minimum GPA requirement for each of the programs they are in:

Valencia 3.0 HS GPA (unweighted for 9-11); 2.0 Valencia GPA

UF 3.6 unweighted

UCF 3.8 as determined by UCF

Please remember, with any DE class you have started for college transcript and GPA, so taking DE classes requires thought and dedication that goes far beyond high school.

Next PSAT- Wednesday October 11th (10th and 1th graders are automatically signed up)

Next SAT- (12th Grade School Day Wednesday October 11th) Saturday October 7th (Late registration sign up by September 26th)

Next ACT- Saturday October 28th (registration deadline September 22nd, late registration by October 6th)



#### **Starting my Dual Enrollment Application**

- 1. Gather student, parent and school representative emails
  - Parent/guardian's email address must be different than students.
  - ☐ Verify school representative (counselor) email
  - Do not use school email, create personal email
  - Verify anticipated graduation date

#### **Overview**

- The mission of the UF Dual Enrollment program is to expand access to a preeminent learning opportunity for Florida's highest achieving students.
- Courses are delivered 100% online in asynchronous format.
- Students may enroll in up to two courses each Fall and Spring semester at no cost.
- Credits can be combined with other advanced coursework to get you even further ahead.






#### **Program Eligibility**

Students seeking participation in the University of Florida Dual Enrollment Program must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:

- Junior or Senior Standing
- 3.6 cumulative unweighted high school GPA
- One of the following minimum composite standardized test scores:
  - PSAT 10/NMSQT score of 1130
  - SAT score 1100
  - ACT score of 22




#### **Applying to UF Dual Enrollment**

Students seeking participation in the University of Florida Dual Enrollment Program must:

- Express interest to their school counselor and meet with them to discuss appropriate coursework.
- Submit initial application on our website: https://dualenrollment.dce.ufl.edu
  - NOTE: Deadline is October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023.
- Stay connected to email for follow-up information.
  - Six steps total from application submission to course registration.

#### **Student Support**

- Before classes begin:
  - Application processing;
  - Assist with course selection;
  - Handle course registration;
  - Facilitate access to course materials.
- After classes begin:
  - Grade checks to support academic success;
  - Centralized point of contact for all UF services.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

- Does participating in UF DE get me into UF?
  - Participating in UF DE can help you stand out and show you can handle the rigor of college courses, but does not directly impact admissions decisions to the University of Florida.
- Will the courses affect my college admissions?
  - Yes. The grade that you receive in your DE courses will go on both your high school and college transcripts and will impact both GPAs.
- How long is a UF course?
  - UF Course will last 1 semester (typically 16 weeks).
- Can I use AP/AICE scores, or other DE credits to bypass pre-requisites and continue in a course sequence?
  - Yes, we can guide you in the process of selecting course taking into account previous AP and college credits earned.
- What is the cost for the classes and books with UF Dual Enrollment?
  - There is **no** cost for taking courses through the dual enrollment program. All course material is also covered.

<u>Dual Enrollment</u>: students in grades 6-12 who desire to dual enroll on a part-time basis, taking one or two courses, while completing their high school coursework (3-11 credit hours)

Early Admission: students who have completed their junior year in high school and would like to enroll at UCF as full-time students for their senior year of high school (12-15 credit hours)

## What You Need to Apply for Consideration:

- Complete Online Application (application fee is waived)
- Official High School Transcript
- ✓ Official SAT (code: 5233) or ACT (code: 0735) scores



### <u>Dual Enrollment/Early Admission Application</u> <u>Completion Deadlines</u>

Fall	May 1 <sup>st</sup>
Spring	November 1st
Summer	March 1st

#### **Dual Enrollment/Early Admission Process**

- 1. Apply
- 2. Submit official High School Transcript
- 3. Submit official Test Scores (SAT or ACT)
- If offered admission, a Dual Enrollment/Early Admission Authorization form is added to your future knight portal checklist
- 5. Student completes Student Authorization form (entering in a counselor and parent contact info)
- 6. Counselor completes Authorization form with student's desired courses
- 7. Parent submits final approval of authorization form
- UCF Major program advisor will approve/deny requested courses
- 9. UCF Major Advisor will provide next steps for class registration, textbooks, etc

#### **Important!!**

- Students can only enroll in the courses that are listed on their authorization form
- Students may be asked to submit AP, IB, AICE, previous Dual Enrollment transcripts to show that prerequisites have been satisfied
- Students must enroll in courses that are Academic Courses, receiving grades (no pass/fail or S/U courses), and receiving credit back at their high schools
- Students can only enroll in undergraduate level courses
- Early Admission students are NOT eligible for merit scholarship consideration after high school graduation
- Students are responsible for requesting their UCF transcript to be sent to their high school

## Orange Technical College Dual Enrollment

- An opportunity for you to get a **jump start** on your career before you graduate from high school.
- An opportunity that may also translate into earning college credits at Valencia College.
- An opportunity to boost your weighted G.P.A.
- An opportunity that is **free** to you while you are a student in high school.



#### How does it work?

- You attend the OTC college campus for three to four periods a day.
- While at the OTC college campus, you are engaged in hands-on learning taught by industry professionals.
- Transportation to and from the OTC college campus is provided & free.



#### There's more!

- You can also gain industry certifications while doing dual enrollment.
- It can mean a higher starting wage for a high school graduate.
- Adult students have to pay to take these tests, but they are **free** to dual enrollment students (while you are in high school).



### OCPS Tech Express to Valencia College

Some programs offer articulation credits to Valencia College.

For example, when a student completes the Fundamental Foodservice Skills program and enrolls in Valencia, they could receive up to 12 credits towards their Culinary Management degree.

The Culinary Management degree requires 60 credits, but a dual enrollment student can complete 20% of that requirement while in high school...for **FREE**.

### Um...that GPA thing? What's that about?

Most of the courses at the OTC college campuses are AP-weighted

So let's think this through...you're in a program that you like.

What grades will you get?

What will happen to your weighted GPA?

Who looks at your weighted GPA?

### What are the eligibility requirements?

- Have a viable career-themed technical goal
- •Junior or Senior in 2023 2024 school year
- •At least a 2.0 unweighted GPA
- On track for graduation
- •Three to four free elective periods available in your schedule
