Diploma Designations

Scholar Diploma Designation

In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must meet all of the following requirements:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2 or an equally rigorous course
- Pass the Geometry EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Pass the Biology 1 EOC*
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC*
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- Earn at least 1 credit in an AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course

*A student is exempt from the Biology 1 or U.S. History EOC assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB or AICE Biology 1 or U.S. History course; takes the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment; and earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

- Meet the standard high school diploma requirements
- Attain one or more [industry certifications](#) from the list established (per s. 1003.492, F.S.)

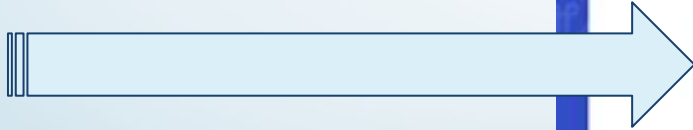

Dual Enrollment - OTC

- Rising Junior or Senior
- At least a 2.0 unweighted GPA
- On track for graduation
- Three free elective periods available in your schedule (Morning @ OTC 1st-3rd Afternoon @ OTC 5th-7th)
- While at the tech college campus, you are engaged in hands-on learning taught by industry professionals.
- You can also gain industry certifications while earning dual enrollment credit.
- It can mean a higher starting wage for a high school graduate.

Dual Enrollment - Valencia

Students who desire to dual enroll on a part-time basis, taking one or two college courses, while completing their high school coursework simultaneously.

Dual Enrollment - UF

Program Eligibility

Students seeking participation in the University of Florida Dual Enrollment Program must meet the following initial eligibility requirements:

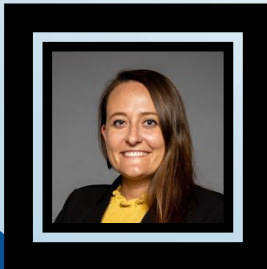
- Rising Junior or Senior
- 3.6 cumulative unweighted high school GPA
- One of the following minimum composite standardized test scores:
 - PSAT 10/NMSQT score of 1130
 - SAT score 1100
 - ACT score of 22

Dual Enrollment and Early Admission - UCF

Early Admission: Students who have completed their junior year in high school and would like to enroll at UCF as full-time students (being enrolled in 4 classes as opposed to 2) for their senior year

What You Need to Apply for Consideration:

- ✓ Official High School Transcript
- ✓ Official SAT (code: 5233) or ACT (code: 0735) scores
- ✓ Complete Online Application (application fee is waived)

Admission Requirements:

Minimum **3.8** high school GPA (as re-calculated by UCF using only academic core courses) *

Test Scores:

- SAT: **1330** (Reading/Writing + Math)
- ACT: **28** (Composite)
- CLT : **95**

Dual Enrollment/Early Admission Application Completion Deadlines

Fall	May 1 st
Spring	November 1 st
Summer	March 1 st

AP Classes vs. Dual Enrollment

AP Classes

- Colleges tend to award credit more easily based on AP test scores (typically 3 or higher)
- Academically challenging classes
- Out-of-state institutions tend to look more favorably on AP classes because the curriculum is familiar
- Helps increase weighted GPA.
- College credit will **not** be awarded by passing the class, student must achieve the required test score

Dual Enrollment

- Students have experience with a college setting while in high school.
- Save money towards earning a degree.
- Helps increase the weighted GPA.
- The student is the only one that can advocate for him or herself. Parents must be “hands off”.
- More variety of classes.
- Students are able to experience different campuses.

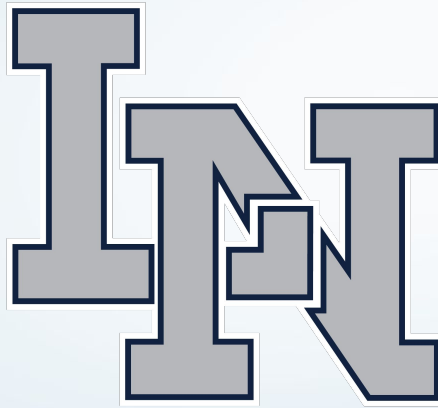
