Call to Order: A meeting of the Lake Nona High School, School Advisory Council was called to order by Melissa Henry at 5:38pm in the Media Center.

Approval of the Minutes: Motion by Michelle Adamick. Second by Ivory Rodante. Motion carries.

Funds Requests: No vote - SAC did not have a quorum

- Ms. Krugh, <u>33957@ocps.net</u> attended the meeting in hopes of requesting money from the SAC Budget for a poster maker for the media center.
- Kari Grimm, <u>36916@ocps.net</u> shared her experiences running Kari's Kloset. She is able to help students in need dress for interviews, dances, and award ceremonies using closet space in classroom 452.
- Ms. Krugh will be at SAC December 14 to discuss School Grade Money. The LNHS Staff will make recommendations for money distribution. SAC will approve or deny the decision.

SAFE (Student Assistance and Family Empowerment Program):

Presentation by Ms. Whitfield, LNHS SAFE Coordinator, tammy.whitfield@ocps.net

- Ms. Whitfield was previously a junior/senior counselor. She switched to SAFE to focus on the social/emotional well being of students.
- Ms. Laura Kempfer, laura.kempfer@ocps.net, is the school based social worker that shares room 669 with Ms. Whitfield. The social worker does about 6 45 minute sessions a day with students.
- Ms. Whitfield has trained the teachers to listen for crisis "buzz words" and then submit requests through a Google Form. Students are then triaged based on the need. She is typically able to see non-crisis students within three days of the request.
- She has done 2 professional development presentations with the teachers this year. She hopes to talk to them again in January concerning "What is a crisis?"
- Parent consent is needed when meeting with students. This is a great resource for getting students back in the classroom and ready to learn.
- School based activities include Red Ribbon Week & Say Hello Week
- Cub Cabinet is fully stocked thanks to parent donations. Both SAC and PTSA are willing to help when the cabinet is in need again.
- Ms. Whitfield does not investigate student matters like bullying. She helps students cope with the issue.
 The Resource Officer is the only person on campus able to Baker Act a student.
- Ms. Whitfield is in the halls during class changes and accessible to the students.

• OCPS is utilizing a program called Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA). All teachers will be required to do this mental health training within the year.

Principal's Update given by Ms. Campbell:

- We have new student data for Algebra, Geometry, ELA 9, ELA 10, Biology & US History. More
 interventions will be added through after school tutoring, direct tutoring, & targeted support. All data will
 be mailed home for parents to see.
- ELL (English Language Learners) Night is being planned to welcome families to school after winter break
- Before Winter Break there will be adjusted bell schedules for Civics tests, PMAs, FAST, and CFEs.
 Admin is trying to chunk the schedule to accommodate dual enrollment and Career & Tech Education students. There will be additional testing in January.
- LNHS may hire UCF Tutors for January and interventions.
- We need 2 math teachers, 1 ELA teacher, an additional History teacher due to student growth, 2 security guards, and 1 front office staff member.
- The Amway Arena has not given us a date for graduation.

School Improvement Plan (SIP):

- Ms. Hughes sent out all the documents in an email to the SAC committee.
 - SIP workshop to identify the barriers for our students.
 - The data identifies the subgroups that are struggling. Then the school can support them.
- The focus this year is on students with disabilities (general education kids with IEPs and 504s, as well as ESE students) and students who qualify for free and reduced lunch (FRL). These were the 2 subgroups identified as needing the most help.
- OCPS Multilingual unit is walking our campus once a month to give support to ELA and math classrooms.
- The SAFE coordinator and mental health pieces are not included in the SIP this year.
- SAC is able to fund Professional Development outside of the district.
- Is there an option for hiring a consultant for ELA through SAC funding?
- Lead person for ELL is Ms. Vargas and lead person for ESE is Ms. Braun

Budget remained the same:

SAC Budget: \$15,597.28 Teacher Supply Fund: \$21,109.26 FL school Recognition Funds: \$9,112.27
