Lake Nona High School School Advisory Council (SAC) Meeting Minutes December 14, 2022

**Call to Order:** A meeting of the Lake Nona High School School Advisory Council was called to order by Melissa Henry at 5:34 pm in the Media Center.

Approval of the Minutes: Motion by Maria Tolosa. Second by Michelle Barber. Motion carries.

**School Recognition Funds:** Ms. Krugh presented the LNHS faculty & staff vote on the allocation of School Recognition Funds (about \$638,000).

- 11 members of the Faculty Advisory Council (FAC) presented 2 options to the staff.
  - Option 1: School Recognition Funds divided equally among everyone (minus 7 administrators) who worked the full 2021-2022 school year at LNHS.
    - 40 staff members voted for this option.
  - Option 2: The 73 newly hired 2022-2023 LNHS staff members would receive \$100 each. The remaining School Recognition Funds would be divided equally among everyone (minus 7 administrators) who worked the full 2021-2022 school year at LNHS.
    - 56 staff members voted for this option.
  - Melissa Henry motioned to approve Option 2 of the School Recognition Funds proposal.
     Second by Maria Tolosa. 2 members (Melissa Henry & Aby Curley) voted to accept the proposal.
     The remaining 15 members voted to reject the proposal.
- School Recognition Fund Allocation needs to be revisited by the FAC in early January.
  - SAC recommends including administration in the allocation of funds.
  - SAC also requests that more faculty and staff participate in the vote, if possible.
- Melissa Henry motioned to have SAC meet one week later than usual (1/18/23, insead of 1/11/23) in order to allow the FAC time to make changes to the School Recognition Fund proposal. Second by Mauricio Movilla. All in favor. Motion passed.
  - New options will be presented to LNHS Faculty & Staff for a vote soon after FAC meets.
  - If the School Recognition Funds proposal is not approved by SAC on 1/18/23, the School Recognition Fund money will be divided equally among the teachers only.

## **Funds Request:**

- Ms. Krugh, <u>33957@ocps.net</u> requested \$3299.00 from the SAC Budget in order to purchase a Perfecta2400 Pro Poster Maker for the media center.
- Melissa Henry **motioned to purchase the poster maker** for the media center. Second by Kim Carlyle Clark. All in favor. **Motion passed**.

## Principal's Update given by Ms. Campbell:

- LNHS is wrapping up PMAs for Biology & US History, CFEs, and Algebra & Geometry Exams.
- Most teachers will have grades wrapped up on Friday before break. Grades are officially due in January.
- Course selection for the 2023-2024 school year begins in January and February. There will be an
  information night for 8th graders/incoming Freshman to visit LNHS and hear about electives and
  program options.
  - The Four Year Pathways presentation has been updated by Ms. Campbell and Ms. Rivera.
  - The Course Selection Sheet has been cleaned up to reflect student grade level.
    - For example, French 3 will not be an option on the freshman sheet.
- Ms. Campbell shared concerns about students vaping in the bathrooms on campus.
  - o It's not good for the kids or the school plumbing when vaping materials get flushed.
  - She would like to start an anti-vaping campaign at school. Suzanne Arnold might be a good resource for this kind of program.
  - Six other area schools (Timber Creek and Boone) have purchased vape detectors for the bathrooms and are seeing positive results. The devices cost about \$2500 per unit. They detect THC and alert administration immediately when the smoke is detected.
    - Ms. Campbell will bring back data from other schools and collect more information on the devices for SAC next month.
    - Discipline numbers are high for vaping at LNHS. It is a level 3 offense. The 7 Assistant Principals and 4 Deans cannot be everywhere to stop it.
    - The 520 & 530 bathrooms are a hotspot. The Portable Vape Indicators would be especially useful in these bathrooms.
    - Administrators can search bags and talk privately to students based on the surveillance cameras outside the bathrooms. Teachers are instrumental in identifying students at LNHS.

School Improvement Plan (SIP): SAC will plan to revisit the SIP in January.
