1. Free Application for Federal Student Financial Aid (FAFSA)

•Opens in October and required for any Financial Aid. Help sessions will be available throughout the year

2. Bright Futures Application

•Opens in October. Counselors will go into Econ/Gov classes to walk you through the process. Make sure you have a plan to reach your 100 hours.

3. Importance of Junior year Spring grades

•You will apply to colleges in late Fall meaning the last real grades you can earn to highlight your abilities and successes are these grades from January to May so you need to really do your best!



We will have Early Release/OJT Forms available at the beginning of summer to fill out for a period(s) off next year.


Requirements for Early Release:

- Be on track for graduation (2.0 GPA, no failed core classes, and passed testing)
- Completed the online course requirement
- Demonstrate you are college and career ready
 - Pass an AP Exam with a 3 or higher
 - Pass a Dual Enrollment course with a C
 - Pass an Industry Certification Exam in a CTE course
 - Adobe Certifications needed to be bundled to qualify

Requirements for OJT (*You can earn up to 3 elective credits for working a minimum of 15 hours a week*):

- All of the above
- Have a job working at least 5 hours/week

Rising Senior Summer to do list:

1. Create a list of 8-10 colleges you have researched and are interested in applying to. Your list should include institutions that are:
 - a. Target- In line with your GPA, test scores, applicant expectations
 - b. Reach- higher than but still within reach based on your GPA, test scores, etc
 - c. Safety- your GPA, test scores, etc are above the institutions average applicant information.
2. Explore essay prompt options on Common App. Choose a few essay topics and draft out your essay.
3. Study for SAT/ACT- use Khan Academy, download apps, buy study guides, look up YouTube videos, Tik Tok, etc.
4. Sign up to take the SAT/ACT early in the fall. School Day SAT is typically in October. Many colleges and Bright Futures superscore SAT/ACT. It is to your advantage to take these multiple times to improve your score.
5. Create your student resume and student profile - information is available on the Lake Nona website.
6. Complete as many community service OR work hours as possible.
7. Start searching for scholarships. There is a large list of scholarships and scholarship search engines on the Lake Nona Website. ***Never supply your social security number on any scholarship application. You should also never pay to apply for a scholarship. ***
