## Things to keep in mind:

- If beginning in the Spring semester, the core classes at LNHS stay on your schedule.
- Please ensure you are looking at courses on the <u>Approved Dual Enrollment List</u> when choosing classes.
- Please also reach out to the <u>Dual Enrollment Coordinators</u> as well before registering for classes to get support on course progressions (especially if your plan is to earn an Associate's degree by graduation).
- Make sure to sign up for classes early!!! Textbook funds are distributed based on student enrollments by a specific deadline each semester.
- Valencia College is a separate entity; therefore, we do not see progress reports. We only receive the final grade. You need to advocate for yourself.
- If you are a senior and want to take your graduation classes at Valencia, you will need to register for those classes during the Fall term of your senior year and pass those classes. If you do not schedule it in Fall, you will have those classes in person at school.
- If you pass the AP English Language Composition Exam with a level 3, you will receive Freshman Comp I credit at Valencia. If you received a level 4 or above, you will receive Freshman Comp I and II credit. You would need to submit the AP test scores to Valencia. If you satisfied the Freshman Comp I and II, you can take Introduction to Literature (LIT 1000) as this course can satisfy your English 4 requirement.
